STEP 2 – Completing the Course Requests Form

- When choosing electives, choose six SEMESTERS of electives
- Spanish I = full year=two semesters
- Art I = one semester
- Study Hall can be taken one or both semesters
- Include alternates



Step 3 - Online Course Requests in PowerSchool

In addition to the course requests form, students should also complete course requests in PowerSchool prior to the Student Scheduling Meetings in Step 4.



STEP 4 – Student Meetings




